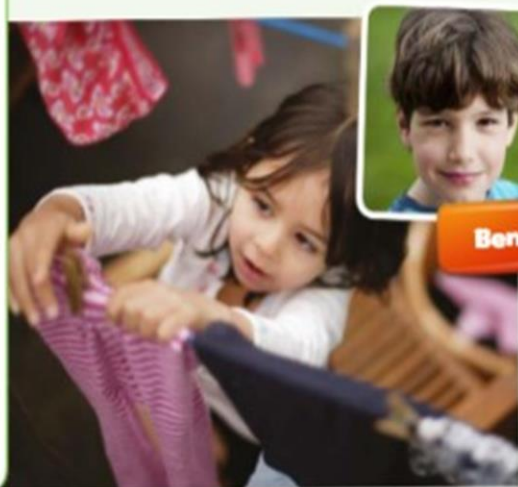

The Big Write tip

It's or Its

Remember to use *It's* and *Its* correctly.

It's is the short form of *It is*, e.g. *It's 12 o'clock on Saturday.* = *It is 12 o'clock on Saturday.*

Its is the possessive form of *It*, e.g. *My sister feeds her rabbit and cleans its cage.*
